

The Asia Pacific Partnership for Atrocities Prevention (APPAP) network is pleased to announce a three-week online training for atrocities prevention. This activity is organised by the Asia Pacific Centre for the Responsibility to Protect (APR2P) at the University of Queensland for members of the APPAP network. It will be held every Monday and Wednesday for three weeks beginning 22 February to 10 March 2021 at the following time zones:

8 am to 10 am (Dhaka)  
830 am-1030 am (Yangon)  
9 am-11 am (Bangkok, Jakarta)  
10 am-12 pm (Manila, Singapore)  
11 am-1 pm (Tokyo, Seoul, Dili)  
12 pm-2 pm (Brisbane)

The online training will be conducted in webinar format, covering different themes where a panel of experts and practitioners will make their short presentations for 10-15 minutes each, followed by an hour of interaction with participants in a Q&A. Some of the speakers will have their presentation in pre-recorded videos, which will be available online after the sessions. Readings related to the sessions during the online training will also be listed and made available to participants in advance.

The main objective of this online training is to provide members of the APPAP network the opportunity to interact with experts, advocates, and practitioners in the region on atrocity prevention. As part of the APPAP's mission to assist in capacity building of stakeholders in the Asia Pacific region, the interactive sessions during the three-week training will also enable members to exchange ideas and share their home-grown knowledge and lived experiences in promoting R2P and how it can be used to deal with pressing issues related to prevention of atrocities.

The sessions in the three-week online training include:

22 February (Monday): R2P after 15 Years: Progress, Challenges, and Prospects  
24 February (Wednesday): Atrocities Prevention: Hate Speech and Incitement  
01 March (Monday): Atrocities Prevention and Women, Peace and Security (WPS)  
03 March (Wednesday): COVID-19: Implications for Atrocities Prevention in the Asia Pacific  
08 March (Monday): The Future of Atrocities Prevention in the Asia Pacific  
10 March (Wednesday): Transitional Justice and Atrocities Prevention
